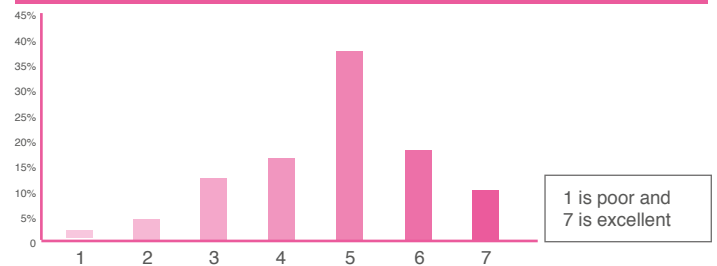

How you would rate the quality of Community Living where you live?



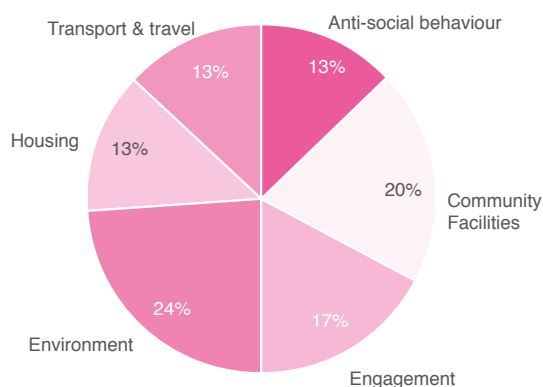
Do you agree with these statements about Community Living in your area?

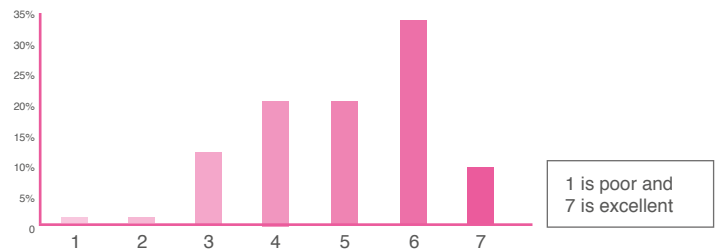
More integrated community events that bring all residents together to share and understand our different cultures.

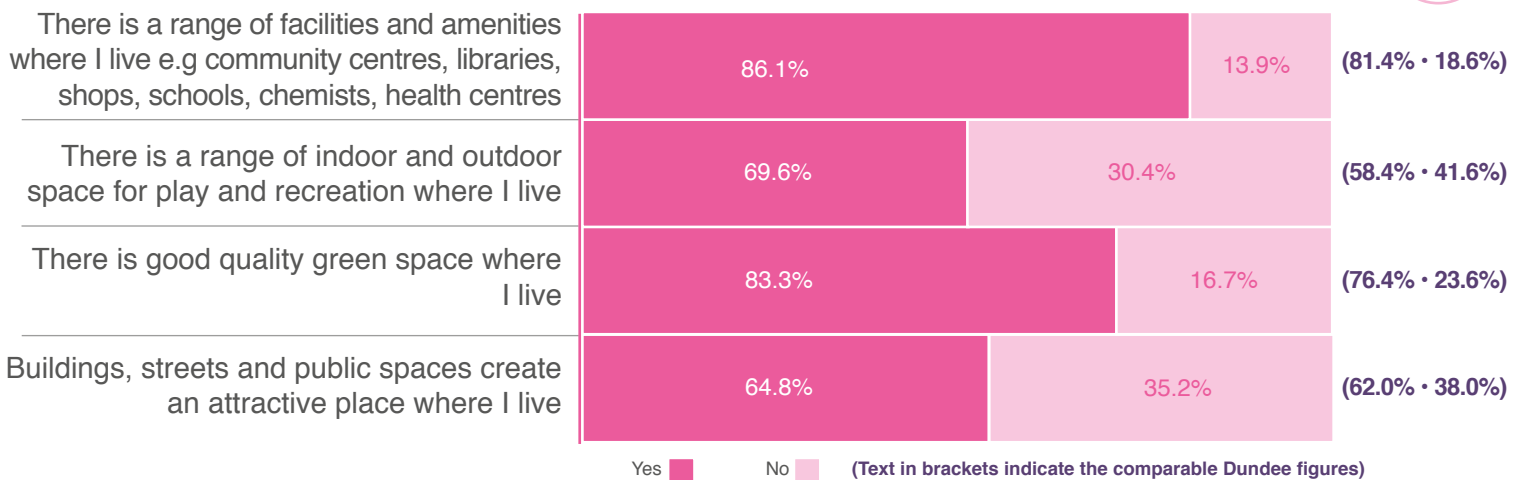

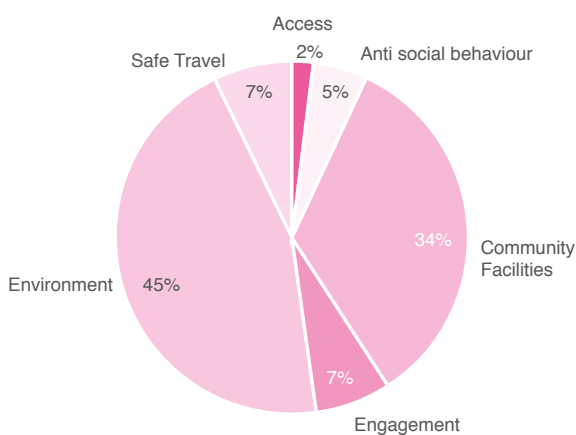
How you would rate the quality of Community Spaces where you live?

What people said would improve Community Spaces.



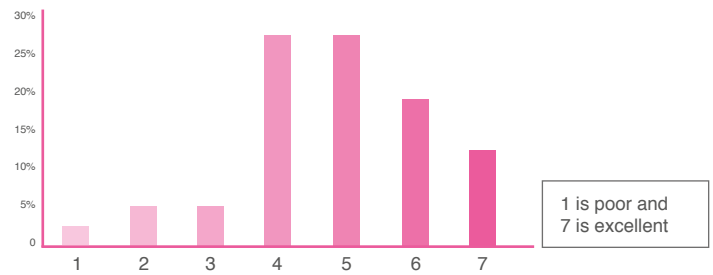
- More greenery on or beside streets.

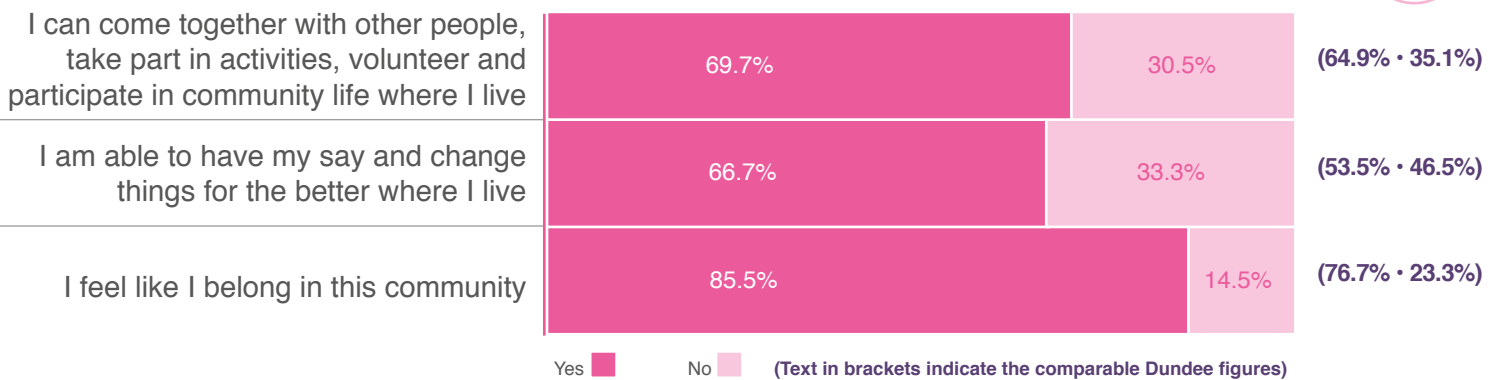

How you would rate the quality of Community Spirit where you live?

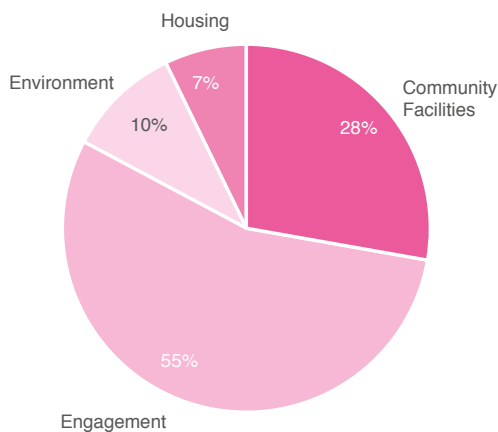

I think regular events aimed at families, like messy church but in a secular location would be popular and increase their reach.

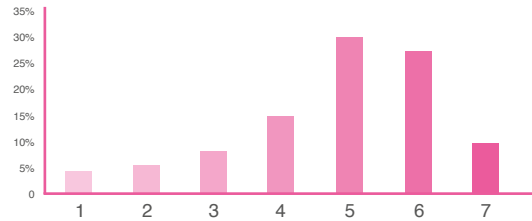
Responsible homeowners and tenants who took pride in housing.

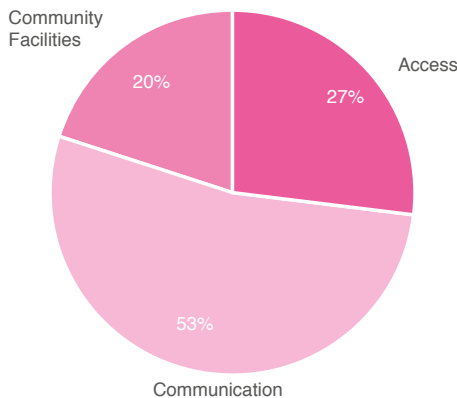

A lot of people in the area don't know what services are available or how to access them, outreach work would be useful by specific services.

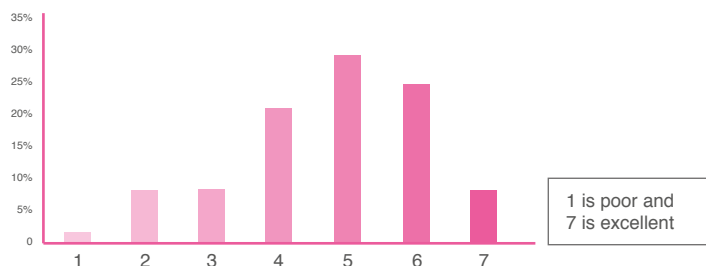
I appreciate all the online offerings, but would value more face to face /person to person or paper based information being available.

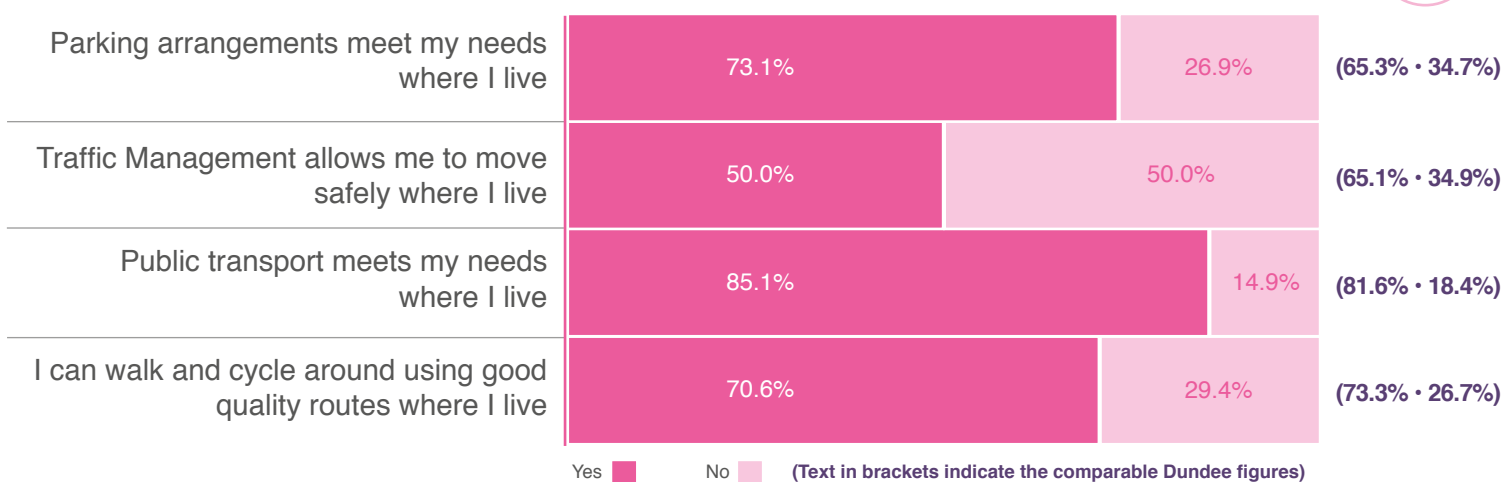

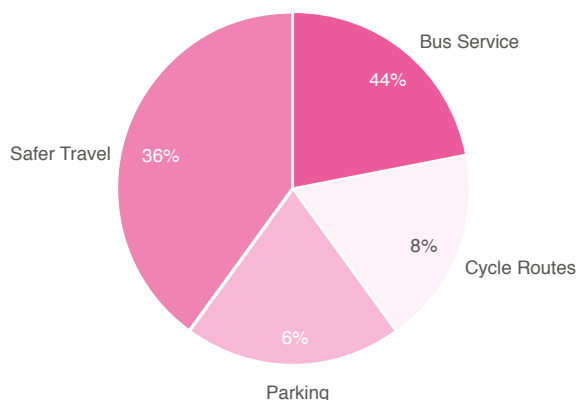
How you would rate the quality of Community Travel where you live?
