### Background

The Communities Mental Health and Wellbeing Fund for Adults (the Fund) was established in October 2021 and to date has distributed around £66 million to community initiatives supporting mental health and wellbeing across Scotland. Funding for a fifth and sixth year (£15 million each year) was announced in March 2025.

The Fund has a strong focus on prevention and early intervention and aims to support grass roots community groups in tackling mental health inequalities and addressing priority issues of:

- social isolation and loneliness;
- suicide prevention; and
- tackling poverty and inequality.

The Fund will continue to be delivered through a locally focused and coordinated approach via local partnership groups:

DVVA, DSEN, External Funding (DCC), Dundee Partnership, DHSCP, Public Health, FORT, NHS Tayside Charitable Trust, Suicide Prevention (DCC), Hope Point

### Fairer Funding

• This is the first time Third Sector Interfaces will receive a multi-year grant award for the Communities Fund.

# Backgro und

- The opportunity to grant funding across two years
  has arisen as part of the Scottish Government's
  Fairer Funding pilot, as part of their commitment to
  deliver fairer funding for the third sector.
- The pilot has been set up to provide more certainty and allow for longer-term planning, aiming to improve stability and cost-efficiency for organisations and services.



# Backgro und

### Fairer Funding

- There are two levels of funding to apply to: Level 1 up to £10k and Level 2 up to £30k.
- You can apply for up to 2 years of funding for your project. For example, applying for £5,000 to receive £2,500 in year 1, 25/26 and £2,500 again in year 2, 26/27.
- The value of the grant payable in year two is an indicative confirmation and cannot be taken as a guarantee: subject to the outcome of any spending review by the Scottish Government and approval of the annual Budget Bills by the Scottish Parliament.
- We highly encourage applications from grassroots organisations and/or groups completely new to the fund and joint applications (new or existing) from those collaboratively working together to address the aims of the fund within their communities.

#### **Local Priorities**

Support community-based initiatives that promote and develop good mental health and wellbeing and/or mitigate and protect against the impact of distress and mental ill health within the adult population (aged 16 or over), with a particular focus on prevention and early intervention.

- Tackle mental health inequalities through supporting a range of 'at risk' groups.
- Address priority issues of social isolation and loneliness, suicide prevention and poverty and inequality with a particular emphasis on responding to the cost-of-living crisis and support to those facing socio-economic disadvantage.
- Support small 'grass roots' community groups and organisations to deliver such activities. [Eligibility section for more details]
- Provide opportunities for people to connect with each other, build trusted relationships and revitalise communities.

Meet at least one of the outcomes

- social isolation and loneliness
- suicide prevention
- tackling poverty and inequality

The people who will benefit from your activity are adults (16+) who live in Dundee

You are not duplicating services in your area

Have a fully completed form with all relevant accompanying documents

You have an income of less than £1 Million

Have an independent bank account

Have a constitution or set of rules

Have an up-to-date year of accounts\*

Be a community group/charity/social enterprise/ other third sector organisation

1 year applications will close in March 2026 and reopen in September 2026 [Scot Gov budget depending]

2 year projects will conclude and be allocated by end March 2026

- **Stage 1:** Expression of interest
- Stage 2: Pre-application shifting process
- **Stage 3:** Invitation to complete application
- Stage 4: Panel review & assessment
- **Stage 5:** Application outcome (award or rejection)
